From the Pastor

Discernment Activities Progress Update

Refocusing People Power

- **Hired Marketing Communication specialist.** One of our biggest accomplishments of this year was the addition of professional help to tell our story. The Personnel Committee finalized a position description, posted for a part-time (50%) Marketing / Communication Manager, and with the help of Claire Mavity, Katie Hartman, Violet Butler, and Matty Strickler hired Maura Dunst.
- **Leadership position descriptions communicated.** A description of the responsibilities of each of the leadership positions was included with the stewardship packet.
- **All social media updated and maintained.** Maura Dunst has updated and revamped the website. Our presence on social media has greatly expanded.
- **Still to be done:** Form Laity Task Force (to revamp the organizational structure); 15 new members (2 new members by mid-May)

Solving Building Issues

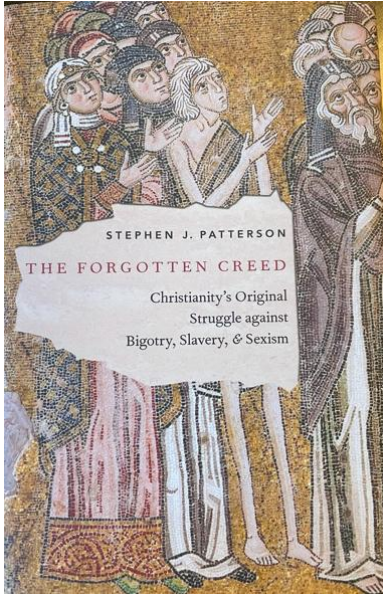
- **Investigated National Registry of Historic Places.** Currently, we've received positive feedback from the state historic agencies, and we submitted the Property Evaluation for final review in mid-May. We hope to have approval from the state for Step 1 by mid-June.
- **Investigated alternative uses of our building.** We have one proposal from an architect's firm that could help us determine our needs and alternate uses and re-design of our building, if we choose to pursue that process.
- **Financed architect's report.** We used the largest amount from the RGR grant to fund another building evaluation done by our architects MacDonald and Mack. We expect to have the results of their findings on the status of our building with recommendations for improvements by the Annual Meeting June 8.
- Had safety vulnerability studies done by the local police representatives to determine ways to improve the safety of our building and grounds for our congregation, renters, and visitors.
- **Still to be done:** Form Building Task Force; Receive Market / Sales Analysis of property; Collect info on congregational building needs / wants; Determine Approximate Cost of Alternative Site.

Opening Our Doors Within and Without

- **Ongoing ad placed in Lavender Magazine** as well as ads in the Pride and Wedding issues. We now have Lavender delivered to the church.
- **Contacted Trans Support Organizations to be listed. Hosted two forums / presentations from Trans Org.** Hosted a 2-part forum and are listed as a welcoming, safe congregation.
- Launched a new branding campaign with a new logo!
- Launched the 175th Anniversary Task Force!
- Evaluated our advertisements and signage. \$5k from the RGR grant was committed to augmenting the marketing budget.
- Hosted an asylum-seeking homeless family overnight during December as part of the Faithful Hospitality network.
- Participated in Sacred Reckonings training in the path toward reconciliation and reparation.
- Created a joint UBC / FCC Task Force to deliberately find ways to reinforce each other's, and our joint, ministries. Having monthly gatherings; finding opportunities to build relationships and support each other. Will have a joint booth at the Pride Festival.
- **Still to be done:** Contact Minnesota Council of Churches re: reparations. Advertise in Women's Press and MN Daily. Visit Dakota Hocokatati; Hold at least two joint events with Mother St. James; Complete Concrete Plan for Repair and Reparations.

SUMMER BOOK: THE HISTORY OF GALATIANS 3:26-28

A group of UBCers plans to read a book together this summer and discuss it over 4-6 meetings. We will meet on Monday evenings at 7 p.m. on Zoom, starting June 2, and will decide at the first meeting whether to meet every Monday night or spread our meetings over the summer.



The book is *The Forgotten Creed: Christianity's Original Struggle Against Bigotry, Slavery, and Sexism*, by Stephen J. Patterson (Oxford U Press, 2018). Patterson is a professor at Willamette University and a historian who specializes in the origins of Christianity. This book explores Galatians 3:26-28, the earliest known Christian baptismal creed, which we gradually adopted as our default affirmation on Sundays at UBC. As Patterson wrote in his introduction:

"Whatever the future holds for our little world, with its big fish like Trump, it is time now more than ever to tell the story of this forgotten first creed. History reminds us again and again that it has always been easier to believe in miracles, in virgin births and atoning deaths, in resurrected bodies and heavenly journeys home, than something so simple and basic as human solidarity. Here, then, is an episode of our history from a time long past, when foreigners were slaughtered, captives sold as slaves, and women kept in their place, when a few imaginative, inspired people dared to declare solidarity between natives and foreigners, free born and slaves, men and women, through a ceremony and a creed. This is the

story of that first, unbelievable creed."

A NEW UBC!

When I was hired at UBC, I knew that one of the first tasks I wanted to tackle was building a new brand identity for the church. A cohesive brand is essential for marketing and communications efforts, as it provides the foundation from which all subsequent materials are created. You have your logo, your color palette, your slogan, your typefaces, and your style guide, and together, they inform everything that flows and grows from those core principles. The new brand is now in place and I'm excited to tell you about the different elements that came together so beautifully!

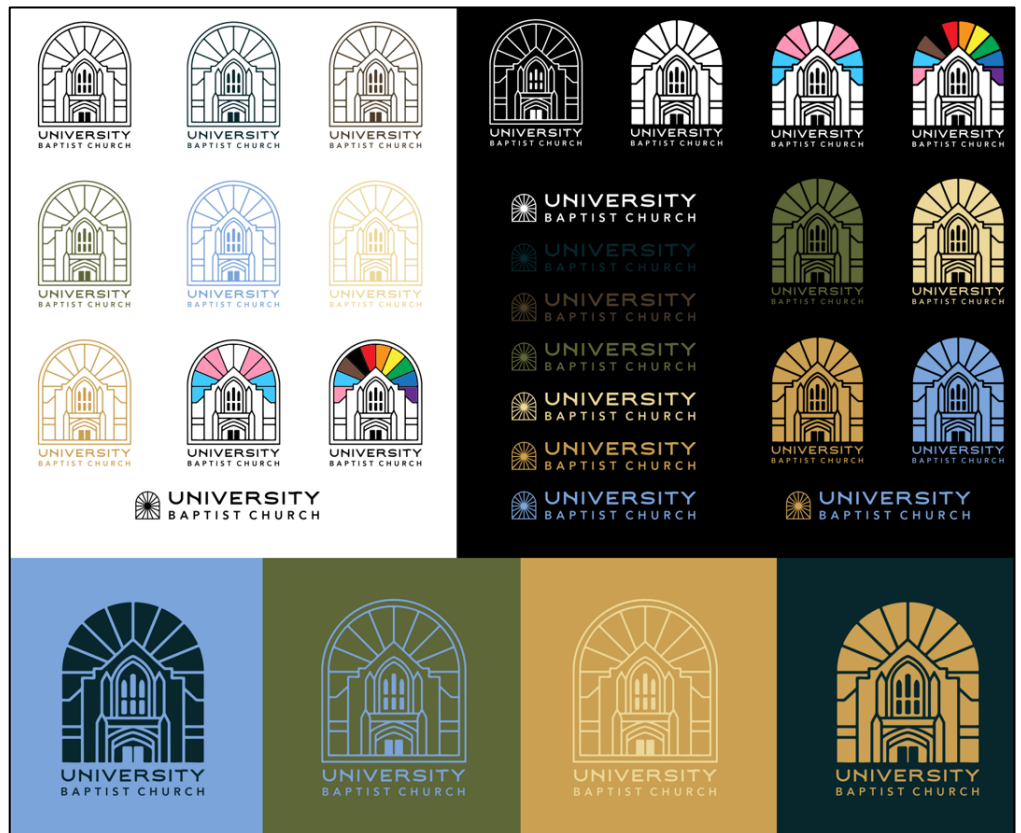
COLOR PALETTE

This is where it all began. When I saw the baptistery tiles, I knew that I had to incorporate those lovely soft blue and sand colors into the palette. The wood stain provided a nice contrasting dark brown. This was my starting point. I color matched the tiles and the wood, and filed those color codes away for future use, borrowing some secondary shades from the stained glass windows in the stairwell. Thanks to Katie Hartman for lending me a color matching swatch book when my phone just wasn't capturing the real colors of the tile! John Medeiros also suggested that we add an olive green to the palette, a reference to both the metaphorical olive branch as well as to Olivet Baptist Church, UBC's former name. It was a great suggestion, as we now have a "heaven and earth" vibe to the palette — blue tones and earth tones.

LOGO

Once I had the base palette colors identified, I reached out to a graphic designer I've worked with on projects before, Alexis Politz, who always knocks it out of the park. She was available and

willing to work on a tight turnaround, which was great news! I shared the color palette with her, as well as some of my suggestions for what I thought might make a good logo. One of the ideas far down on the list was the sanctuary entrance. Alexis said that she thought this was the winner — it would work well in several formats, translate easily at a glance so you know exactly what you're looking at, blend the ancient and the modern when rendered as a line drawing, incorporate an iconic element of UBC's identity, and, equally importantly, it would just look cool. It took some convincing, but I'm so glad she pushed me in that direction! She was right, on all counts. She created a line drawing of the "front door," with inverse versions in each color, as well a smaller horizontal wordmark. Here's all of the different versions laid out together:

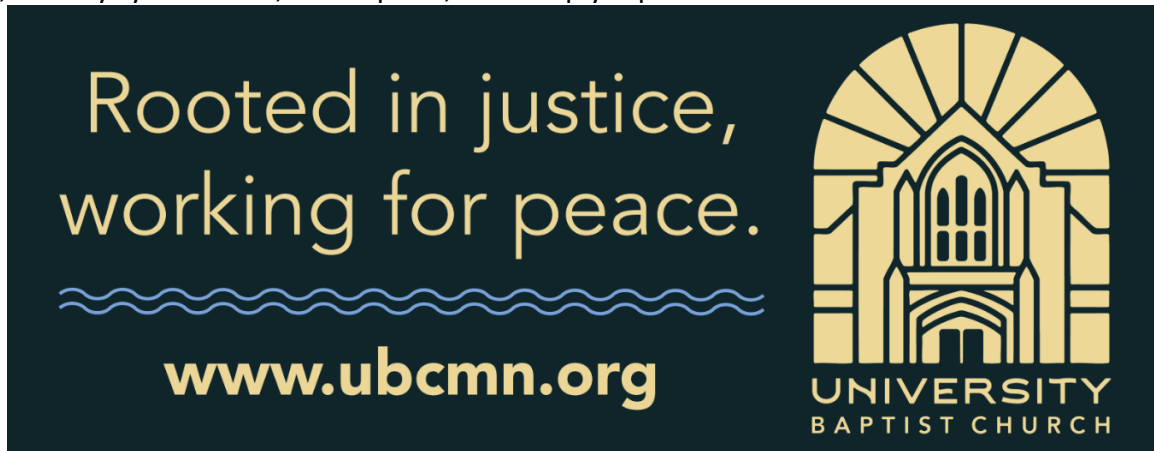

Branding – continued

SLOGAN

I recently learned that the word “slogan” derives from the Gaelic word for battle cry — a call to action that unifies a group in its shared purpose. UBC has dabbled in slogans through the years, with a handful floating in and out of use for various purposes, but nothing has been consistent. I got so many great slogan suggestions from the congregation in my survey responses, but the clear frontrunner was this: **Rooted in justice, working for peace.** Clean, tidy, visually symmetrical, to the point, and deeply representative of UBC’s values.



FONTS

Alexis, the graphic designer, chose two typefaces for us. The word “University” in the logo is in a font called Cedros, with its little brother font, Cedros Thin, also available as needed. The words “Baptist Church” are in the typeface Avenir, which comes with many different font variations in different weights. I love the echo of the logo that appears in the wavy lines in the N, E, and T of Cedros! They look like they were made to be together. The clean simplicity of “Baptist Church” balances out the more ornate elements so well.

Financial Secretary's Report

Most of our income (58%) comes from pledges made by members. We are entering the final month of the current fiscal year and pledges are running way behind where we would like them to be however, I anticipate these pledges will still come in.

Rental income is on budget thanks to sporadic rental of the gym, assembly hall and/or sanctuary. Rental

income of \$72,004 covers approximately 20% of our budget. Other gifts and miscellaneous income provide 4% of our budget. Thanks to some generous donations, we are ahead of budget on this item. The UBC Foundation distribution is 18%, which includes \$34,401 for the property manager position.
