From the Pastor

Renewal in San Juan

he month of June holds not only graduation parties and long-overdue rest for busy students and their families. It also is the month for reunions.

Many of us begin our travel season in June. And if you are like many of us, travel takes on a different kind of energy this side of the pandemic. Some people are going to

travel to densely populated places instead of the remote ones that were safer during COVID.

I'm looking forward to two events toward the end of the month. I'll be attending the Biennial Convention of the American Baptist Churches, USA. Right afterwards, I'll be attending the summer conference of the Baptist Peace Fellowship of North America ~Bautistas por la Paz. Both will be taking place in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

I'm looking forward to seeing old friends, and making some new friends along the way. I'm looking forward to finding ways to make our ministry at UBC more relevant and inspiring to someone new. I'm looking forward to hearing about the ministries of peacemaking and justice seeking that others are doing. I'm looking forward to putting to use some of Anielka's weekly Spanish lessons. But mostly I'm looking forward to connecting more with the scattered family that is this movement of people who are inspired by the Gospel.

Community Safety Meeting

On Tuesday, May 9 about 100 people gathered in the Adele Fadden Assembly Room to discuss the previous particularly violent weekend in Dinkytown.

In addition to police, concerned residents, business owners, parents, community activists, elected officials, University of Minnesota representatives, there were several news outlets.

Apparently, the majority of the troubles that weekend stemmed from teenagers, largely from the southern and western suburbs looking to make trouble by picking on random





strangers and then posting their escapades on social media. The incidents happened late at night or early in the morning. Everyone was united in the desire to keep the neighborhood safe.

The City responded by promising increased lighting, patrols, and enhanced neighborhood watch actions. The event was organized by the Marcy Holmes Neighborhood Association and the Dinkytown Business Alliance. As weather gets warmer and school responsibilities wind down, the neighborhood energy shifts. We are hoping that the events were an anomaly and not the norm going forward.

DID YOU KNOW?...

Dinkytown is the most densely populated neighborhood in the state. There are over 7,000 residents and it will be 10,000 residents in two years, thanks to a couple of new apartment buildings coming on line.

He reported on the data collected from us and the other 26 THRIVE churches. While many churches are leaning into their discomfort with the issues, the churches in the

southern U.S. seem to be getting more pushback from their congregations than we are experiencing. He shared some insights about

churches like ours, queer-friendly justice-oriented churches, which are having similar struggles with retaining membership after the pandemic. We spent a lot of time telling our stories, giving Mark more of a sense of our unique ministries. Having people articulate their joys and concerns about UBC in this point in history is an essential starting point for our discernment process and long-range planning. He promised to come back more in the coming years.



Several UBCers went to George Floyd Square on May 27 to commemorate the third anniversary of Floyd's murder and to witness and build community with the people in that neighborhood.


There were a variety of exhibits, interactive art installations, food, music, and spoken word amongst the places for quiet reflection. George Floyd Square is more than a place. It's an idea and

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

As we head towards the end of our fiscal year at the end of this month, UBC's income remains healthy.

Most of our income (52%) comes from the pledges made by members. As of May 28, pledges are running slightly behind. Please let me know ASAP if you have any changes to your expected pledge.

Expected annual rental income is \$74,000 (20% of our budget.) This is a large increase over last year's \$60,000. Income to date for this item reflects a surplus as our largest renter received a grant and pre-paid some rent. In addition, we've received more than anticipated income from miscellaneous renters.



Other gifts and miscellaneous income provide 4% of our budget. These are mostly gifts made by pledgers beyond their pledge or from people who did not pledge.

The Foundation distribution is 18%, which includes 9% (\$32,053) for the

property manager position. The Foundation funds are transferred to the UBC checking account as needed by the treasurer.
