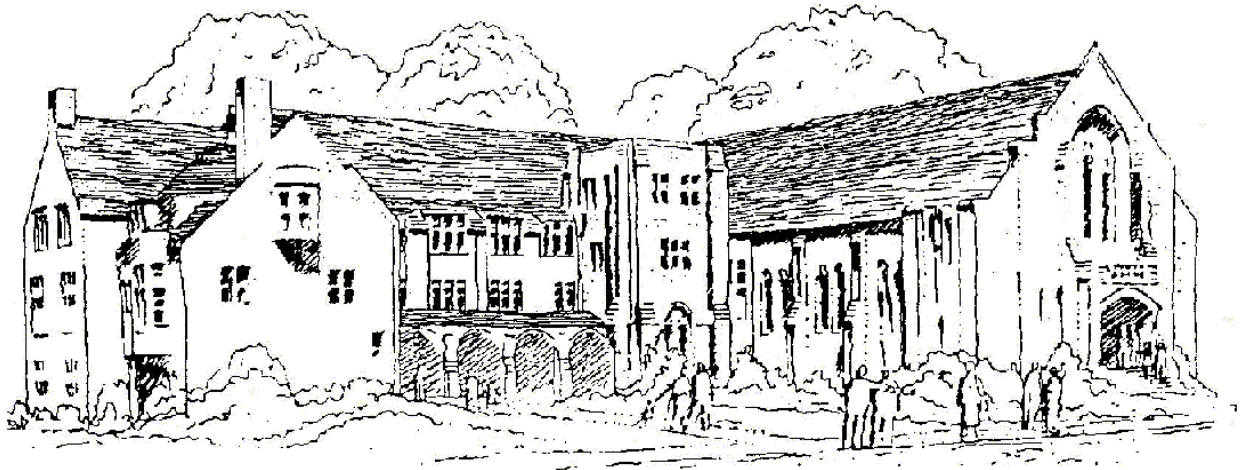

Volunteer Opportunities

The Sacred Harp singers are collecting items that might be needed for trans refugees coming to Minnesota. If you know of people who need any of these items, please let me know. There will be a donation box in the UBC singing room 303 from Tuesday 1/13 through Tuesday 1/20. Please consider donating your unneeded winter hats, gloves, mittens, scarves, boots, coats, and blankets to recently arrived trans refugees from southern states.

A recent survey found that 9% of trans Americans have moved to another state since November of 2024. That translates into ~400,000 people, not including additional family members. The Twin Cities area is receiving a substantial share of these folks. Some have never experienced winter weather, and many must move on a shoestring or are arriving with only the possessions they could fit in their car. Your donation will convey a tangible message of welcome and comfort to an overwhelmed individual, couple, or family, as well as meeting the practical needs of our new neighbors.
